End of Early Years Foundation Stage	End of Key Stage 1
<p><u>Use voice expressively and creatively</u></p> <p>Children sing along to Nursery rhymes and songs for Nativity Play</p> <p><u>Play tuned and untuned instruments</u></p> <p>Children play triangles, drums and tambourines to accompany Nursery rhymes, keeping beat and tempo. Children play tuned bells to accompany songs from Nativity play</p> <p><u>Listen with concentration and understanding</u></p> <p>Children listen and clap syllables in words, including their own and others names. Children learn words from Nativity songs and keep time</p> <p><u>Experiment with, create, select and combine sounds</u></p> <p>Children learn to play instruments to accompany Nativity songs. Children compose their own music during child initiated learning</p>	<p><u>Use voice expressively and creatively</u></p> <p>Children learn to sing Hands, Heart and Feet. Children learn to sing I wanna play in a band Children learn to sing songs for Nativity play</p> <p><u>Play tuned and untuned instruments</u></p> <p>Children learn to play a variety of African instruments (Djembe drums, bongos, shekere, thumb piano to accompany Hands, Heart and Feet. Children can recognise the sound of woodwind and percussion instruments. Children can name some of the instruments of the orchestra and how to play them.</p> <p><u>Listen with concentration and understanding</u></p> <p>Children play in time to a steady beat. Children sing back a specific note (C, D, F and G)</p> <p><u>Experiment with, create, select and combine sounds</u></p> <p>Children will work as a class to compose and perform an original piece of music. Children will practice reading, identifying and drawing notes within the major C scale. Children will use music notation, including the treble clef and the major C scale Children experiment with Garageband to combine a variety of instruments.</p>

End of Lower Key Stage 2

Play and perform

Children learn to play the glockenspiel, using notes C, D, E and F to accompany Roundabout, Portsmouth and March of the Golden Guards
Children receive tuition in the Ukulele as part of the Resonate Music Service and learn to play a variety of pop and traditional tunes
Children perform pieces at end of year concert

Improvise and compose music

Children use Glockenspiel to improvise using notes C, D, E and F
Children compose their own piece using the notes they have learned.
Children use a musical stave to compose their own music.

Listen and appraise

Children listen to a variety of Reggae music, comparing them to each other and other types of music such as pop and rock.

Use and understand staff and other musical notation

Children read and follow musical notation during Ukulele lessons and Glockenspiel tuition.

Appreciate and understand a wide range of live and recorded music

Children to take part in visit to Philharmonic and evaluate it.
Children listen to a variety of pop and Reggae music and understand the differences in tempo, rhythm and lyrics.

Develop an understanding of the history of music

Children examine the development of pop music throughout the 70s and the origins of Reggae music

End of Upper Key Stage 2

Play and perform

Children learn to play the recorder (notes B, A, G, D and E). They will perform Jingle Bells at the Christmas concert and 5 note samba at the end of year concert.
Children learn and perform 2 pieces (Lean on me and You've got a friend) to perform at end of year concert

Improvise and compose music

Children improvise using the recorder during music lessons
Children work in groups using Garageband to compose an orchestral piece.

Listen and appraise

Children examine the lives and works of Composers (Benjamin Britten, Jean Baptiste-Lully, Mozart,)

Use and understand staff and other musical notation

Children use musical notation to play recorder.
Children look at pentatonic scale

Appreciate and understand a wide range of live and recorded music

Children listen to rap, rock and gospel music, noting the differences and purposes.

Develop an understanding of the history of music

Children examine the history of Rock music and the origins of Rap and Gospel
