Religious Education	People Children will learn that, for Christians, the pattern and ideal of family life is found in the Scriptures and God is the loving parent of the human family and Jesus was born and lived in a human family. This topic explores the truth that Jesus had a natural family with real people with names and a history. Called Children will learn that Christians believe that everyone is invited to share in the life and work of God through Baptism. The Bible recounts God's invitations to people to share in his life and work: among them Moses, Samuel, the prophets, Mary and the apostles.
