Termly Curriculum Overview

Spring 1 **Galilee to Jerusalem** In this branch, pupils will encounter the Gospel of St Matthew. Matthew's gospel is divided into seven books. The first contains the birth and infancy narratives, the last describes Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection, and the five books in between give an account of the life and ministry of jesus. In parts of this gospel, St Matthew gathers similar stories and accounts as they all point to the same message. The scriptural texts studied in this branch draw from two sections: a narrative section on ten miracles and a sermon on parables. Jesus may not have performed ten miracles in sequence or told parables one after the other, but St Matthew puts them together as they all indicate a greater truth Religious about building the Kingdom of God. Education Epiphany means to reveal. In everyday speech we sometimes refer to 'epiphany moments' in our own lives when we suddenly realise something or understand something we didn't know before. Following the Christmas season, the Sunday gospels cover a series of epiphanies in the account of his baptism and the wedding feast at Cana. Note: Teachers may wish to revise the Sacrament of Reconciliation from the Year 2 if some pupils are being prepared for this sacrament in their parish at this time. English Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar	Grammar They will look at word families based on common words, showing how words are related in form and meaning. Science	Plants Children will work scientifically to observe how plants grow over time and generate their own ideas for an investigation. They will learn to describe each step of how a plant grows and explain the process of pollination.
Geography	Volcanoes and earthquakes. Children will learn about the Earth's crust and how volcanoes form. They will then learn the features of a volcano and locate some of the worlds most famous volcanoes using maps and atlases. The unit will conclude with children learning about the hazards of living in a volcanic area.
Physical Education	Hockey Children will develop and build on their hockey skills, learning to use appropriate equipment. Swimming Children will build on their swimming ability, learning key survival skills in the water and building up confidence.
Computing	Touch Typing The children will be introduced to typing terminology. They will learn the correct way to sit at the keyboard and how to use the home, top and bottom row keys. They will also practice typing with the left and right hand.
Art and Design	Painting - Monet The children will be looking at the artist Claude Monet. They will improve their mastery of arts during printing activities and they will review their own art work. The children will look at examples of peers and others work.
Music	Animals Pupils start to speak in the foreign language and work on building up their memory skills. Pupils will repeat & then recall from memory with good pronunciation and high accuracy a variety of nouns & articles. Pupils will engage in short, simple spoken tasks using supported short conversation scaffolds and role play activities.
PSHE	Mental health and emotional wellbeing The children will be encouraged to name some personal achievements and goals for the future. They will also share strategies to help them deal with ups and downs they may face.

Relationships, Sex Education	Physical Pupils will be able to describe and give reasons why friendships can break down, how they can be repaired and strengthened.
