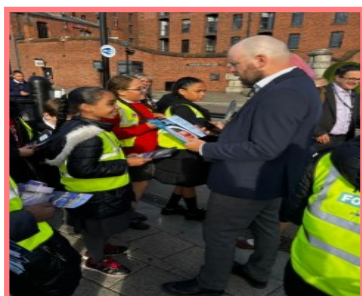
Eco Council

The money raised will support global Fairtrade initiatives to ensure farmers get a fair deal for their goods.



No Child Left Behind Campaign

This half term a selection of our pupil representatives took part in the No Child Left Behind campaign, organised by the NEU at the Labour Party Conference. They gave out leaflets as part the ongoing campaign for Free School Meals for all primary pupils. We were delighted to received wonderful feedback on their conduct and the impact they have made to this cause. We are very proud of them all. This activity has also supported our application to become a UNICEF Silver Rights Respecting School, ensuring that all of our pupils are aware of and stand up for their Rights as a Child.





Meet a Judge Visit

On 13th October 2025, members of our Junior Leadership Team, School Council, and Rights Respecting Ambassadors visited the Liverpool Civil

and Family Court. They took part in a mock robbery trial, taking on different courtroom roles, and had the opportunity to speak with three serving judges from the Crown, Family, and Employment Courts. It was a fantastic experience that gave our pupils a real insight into how the justice system works. We are so proud of how brilliantly they represented our school.



Rights Respecting Schools

Our new Rights Respecting Ambassadors led an informative whole-school assembly to share their work and remind everyone how we can keep children's rights real in our school. They spoke with confidence and enthusiasm, a fantastic start to their new roles!

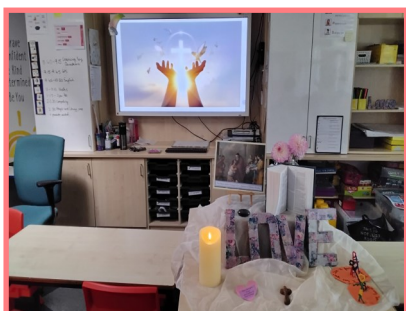
Stewardship of God's Creation

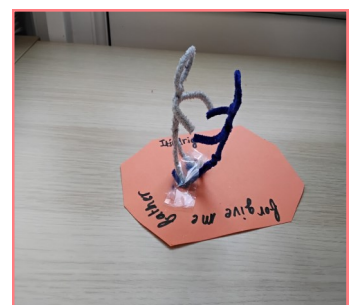
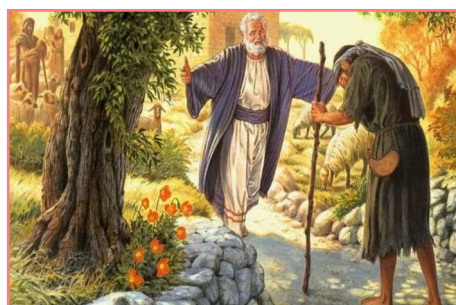
Visit to St Clare's Church

The Prodigal Son

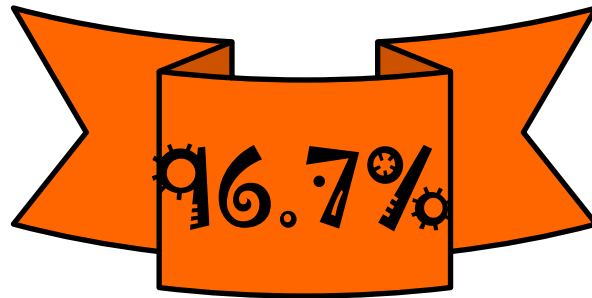

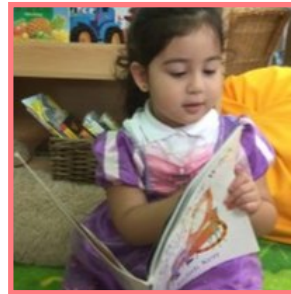
